

"Then Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel to Shechem and called for the elders of Israel, for their heads, for their judges, and for their officers; and they presented themselves before God." (Jos 24:1 NKJV)

as they moved into the promised land. I was trying to find when they stopped camping and found the last occurrence in the verse at the beginning of this write-up.
